Breein Tyree grabs final home win for his senior night

Ole Miss Men's Basketball defeats Missouri Tigers 75-67

OXFORD, Miss., March 5, 2020 – On Wednesday night, more than 6,000 fans gathered in the Pavilion to honor senior guard Breein Tyree's final home game. The Rebels came on top defeating Missouri by eight points. Both Missouri and Ole Miss went into the matchup with the same record. In his final game at the Pavilion, Tyree was the game's leading scorer with 19 points. This is nothing new; Tyree is the team's leading scorer averaging 33.8 points per game. "While his on-court accolades are numerous and impressive, I believe that the things he has consistently done off the court has set him apart from others," said Nathan Dye, video coordinator for Ole Miss men's basketball. "He has always made it a point to connect with the fans."

Tyree has enjoyed playing in front of his fans at every home game. Tyree never fails to get the student section on their feet and make kids in the stands smile. "Breein's interaction with us makes the game more fun and gets our energy way up," said Abby Allen, student at Ole Miss. "I will miss the energy that he brings to the court in the future seasons."

Tyree has been very impactful during his four years at Ole Miss. He has been on several All-SEC Teams, and he is currently a Howell Trophy finalist that is given to the best men's college basketball player in Mississippi. It is Tyree's second consecutive year to be the Chair of SEC Basketball Leadership Council.

The first 1,000 fans received a commemorative poster of Tyree, and the students received a free T-shirt with his number on the front and back. While it was Tyree's last time on Craddock Court, his time with Ole Miss is not finished yet. The Rebels will take on the Mississippi State Bulldogs in Starkville on Saturday and compete in the Southeastern Conference Tournament next week.
